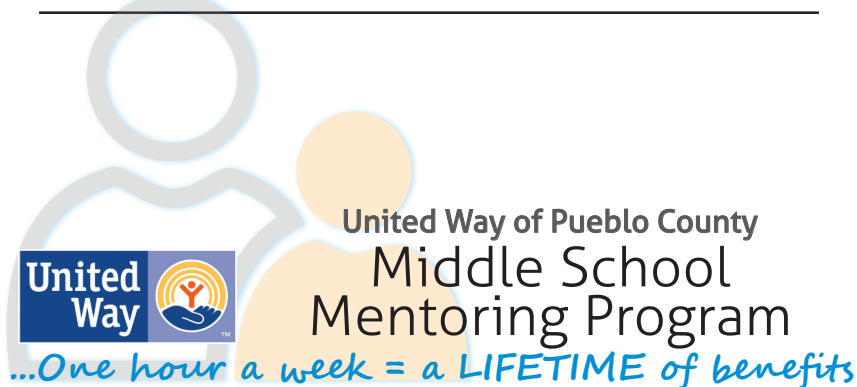


You don't need super powers to make a difference... **BE A MENTOR!**

| <u>When:</u> | Program Runs from Fall 2018 - End of the School Year |
| <u>How:</u> | Mentors are asked to spend just <u>1 hour per week</u> with their student during the lunch hour through the duration of the program |
| <u>Students:</u> | Male and female - 6th, 7th, & 8th grade students |
| <u>Mentors:</u> | Employees that are available 1 hour/week during lunch so that they can mentor students. Having time, being committed and attentive during the time with the student is crucial. A second key quality that mentors have to possess is dependability. Safety screening, references, interview and training required for all potential mentors. |
